

### 2022 Youth Wilderness

### PROGRAM REPORT


he 2022 season was another year of enormous growth for Montana Wilderness School. We successfully ran 13 open enrollment expeditions and 9 contract expeditions. I am happy to report that 207 students had fundamentally transformative experiences in the unique wild lands of Montana and Idaho. Students were immersed in wild places for 3-25 days and educated about wilderness self-care, camp craft, Leave No Trace, communication, mountaineering, rock climbing, canoeing, packrafting, horse packing, and backpacking. We increased the number of backpacking and canoeing expeditions, which provided more opportunities for students to participate in the program's most accessible courses. Feedback from parents and students was resoundingly positive, solidifying our belief that these experiences are constructive and impactful, and provide an opportunity for personal growth.

Enrollment was strong with our expanded course offerings, and the Outreach & Admissions team did an exceptional job with online and in-person recruiting. We grew student enrollment by 30%, serving 102 students in open-enrollment courses and 105 students in contract courses. We saw another increase in student diversity—MWS remains unwavering in our efforts to

enroll a more inclusive and equitable cohort, particularly from underserved urban, rural, and native communities around Montana. Due to our continued success raising financial aid funding, we were able to provide full or partial scholarships to 62% of our Montana students, and no participant was turned away from MWS for financial reasons.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Gar Duke—Co-founder and driving force of MWS for the last 10 years—for all that he has done for this organization. Gar has transitioned away from Executive Director, but his belief in MWS's vision and his fortitude to make our youth program happen has laid a strong foundation for our future. His tireless dedication and steadfast commitment created a community of dedicated individuals working hard to create a lasting impact on the lives of our students. Gar is truly an incredible person with an inspiring commitment to making the future a bit wilder for Montana youth. We can't thank him enough for all that he has done for MWS and the youth we serve.

Let me also formally welcome Martha Sellers as the new Executive Director. Martha's uncompromising commitment to MWS and to the youth of Montana is unparalleled and will lead MWS into the next chapter. Even with all the changes at MWS, I like to remind myself that providing youth with an opportunity to immerse themselves in the backcountry and connect with their peers in wild spaces remains our sole focus and is incredibly impactful to our community.


